March 11th, 2025 GSWAM Business Meeting Minutes

Meeting Attendees: 17

Last Month's (February 2025) Business Meeting Minutes: Dana Pierce made a motion (seconded by Frank Rowell) to accept the February business meeting minutes. Minutes approved by a majority show of hands vote of the attending club members.

Field Report: Frank Rowell reported three mowers have completed their maintenance tasks and are ready for the 2025 mowing season. The club took up a donation for a newer 300 series John Deere mower with a 42" deck. The new mower is still under a four year/300 hour warranty. Darrell Abby fronted the \$2,921.88 purchase price while 11 club members donated \$3,011.00 of which Darrell was reimbursed. Thank You Darrell!! We still have to depend on three older mowers holding up besides the one new mower. The 300 series John Deere mowers carry a \$3,799.00 price tag when new.

Treasurers Report: Club treasurer Michael Madar reported all bills paid. Also reported was club president Tim Lovett renegotiating the clubs dumpster fees and achieved a \$130.00 reduction in service fees. We are still working with Trugreen to minimize service fees for their lawn service keeping up the runway grass. After comparing the costs for Trugreen to maintain the grass vs having the club maintain the runway grass the costs between the two are a wash not making it feasible for club members to fertilize the runway grass. The cost of fertilizer alone was reported to be \$600.00.

Recessing The Front Gate Back for Safety: Dana Pierce with assistance from Paul Lange are looking into planning and getting cost estimates to widen and move the gate back from Randol Mill Rd so those who open or close the gate are not exposed right next to the main roadway when getting out of their vehicles to open/lock the front gate.

Starter Stand Lumber Donation: Dana Pierce offered to purchase the lumber for a new starter stand. To help prevent future starter stand leg rot and to make mowing and cleanup around the starter stands adding concrete pads under the starter stands to sit on was discussed. The new starter stand will be assembled at this months work day. Thanks again Dana!

Dawn Patrol Event: There was a discussion regarding having the GSW club host a Dawn Patrol event scheduled May 17th.

Probation Membership Level: Next month the club will be looking into establishing a new member "probationary" membership level that allows new members to have full flying privileges but not be a full voting member for a period of one year. After the one year probation period expires club members vote to either add the member as a regular club member or not. Many other clubs in the area offer the same probationary membership level. The probation period is one calendar year after which time a probationary member's status can be voted on at a regularly scheduled monthly club meeting. Adding a probationary membership level requires a substantial club by-law modification and as such the by-law change particulars will be made available via discussion at the April 2025 club business meeting after which the results will be posted in the club newsletter. After the probationary membership level membership discussion has been completed and the resulting information is posted in the club newsletter there will be a club vote to either accept the new membership level or not. GSW club officers with an assist from club member Paul Lange will provide a by-law change proposal document for the general club membership to approve/disapprove via a show of hands vote at a regularly scheduled monthly business meeting.






Something To Be Said About Lewie Moore's Passing On 2/26/2025

For those who were not GSW club members in the early 2000's and did not experience the club's original main runway perils I would like to share with you how we ended up with the wonderful flying facility we enjoy today. The original club runway was very rough, short, and made up of mostly dirt, clay, lots of rocks, gullies, and sparse weeds and was nothing like the current runway. Lewie Moore stepped up and provided the GSW club with heavy construction equipment, equipment operators, and his expertise to pull all the needed heavy equipment and operators together to layout, level, and build the runway we enjoy to this day. Lewie Moore had countless hours invested in building the runway, sewing grass seed, covering the grass seed with sand using a rake, and then deploying and moving the heavy watering hoses to help keep the new grass seed ready to germinate into beautiful new Bermuda grass, and germinate it did! Back then we didn't have an automatic sprinkler system. Workers had to unroll large diameter heavy watering hoses and connect them to the sprinklers on the runway multiple times a week during the growing season, and then roll the hoses back up to be ready for the next watering session. The newly planted grass seeds soon grew into the lush green turf on the runway we are blessed with today. Lewie ran the mowing crew back then and spent many, many a hot summer's day mowing the runway along with all the other members of the mow crew (of which many are still around and working today). I had the pleasure of working with Lewie mowing the main runway, as Chuck Rovell did before me, using the ganged reel mower and the 1980s vintage John Deere tractor mower to pull the reel mower (which we still have today). If our R/C flying club ever had a club member known for his dedication to the success and upkeep of the GSW flying facility that person would be my friend Lewie Moore. Flying model airplanes with friends is a privilege of which I am very thankful for. May Lewie have clear blue skies and tailwinds forever more. Sonny Coleman
